WORLD'S LARGEST KINARA ON DISPLAY AT CAMPUS MARTIUS DURING KWANZAA

This winter, in celebration of Kwanzaa, Umoja Debate Team participated in Detroit's first Kwanzaa celebration. Detroit welcomed the world's largest Kwanzaa Kinara to Campus Martius in downtown Detroit as part of the first Motor City Kwanzaa Celebration. This was made possible through collaboration between the Downtown Detroit Partnership, Alkebu-Lan Village, Councilman Scott Benson, Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History, and the City of Detroit. The Motor City Kwanzaa Celebration kicked off on the first day of Kwanzaa, December 26, 2022 at Beacon Park.

During the celebration, Umoja Debate Team presented on the first principle of Kwanzaa, Umoja, or Unity. Umoja Debate Team informed the community about the organization, the impact that has been made, and future goals, as well as the importance of Unity throughout their journey.

Following the presentation, was the lighting of the "Umoja" candle on the 30-foot-tall kinara as well as a demonstration and discussion on the seven principles of Kwanzaa: Unity, Self-determination, Collective Work and Responsibility, Cooperative Economics, Purpose, Creativity, and Faith.
